1	<p><u>REQUEST FOR INTERNATIONAL ASSISTANCE</u></p>	<p>The Government of Indonesia has stated that they will carefully review and clear all forms of international assistance. Countries and organizations are required to use the form with the link below and wait for the approval of the authorities.</p> <p>https://docs.google.com/forms/d/e/1FAIpQLSd6Kipg-hsUg5rbU1cJYnVir47RtggSlzQC_sva-HcvYtBTA/viewform</p> <p>The Indonesian Government has formed a Task Force to receive and manage humanitarian assistance from the domestic and foreign country, which include Coordinating Ministry for Political, Law, and Security Affairs (Kemenkopolhukam), Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and BNPB.</p> <p>Acceptance of foreign humanitarian assistance through one door in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.</p> <p>Any financial donation from the foreign government should be channeled through National Board for the Disaster Relief (BNPB, <i>sic</i>). 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2	<p><u>ENTRY POINTS</u></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Airports (See our Airport Situation Report NO 4): <p>CIQP facilities and process for international assistance can only be done at Balikpapan Airport (BNP Airport), Sultan Aji Muhammad Sulaiman International Airport and at East Kalimantan.</p> <p>Other point of entry at Halim Perdanakusuma Airport (Jakarta) and Makassar Airport are only designated for domestic / in-country relief items. Arrangements will be made by the Indonesian Air Force.</p> <p>Palu Airport is being operated by the military: Commercial flights are now operating. The airport buildings are damaged, and most of the roof has collapsed. The usable runway length has been reduced to 2 km allowing only C130 aircrafts and below to land.</p> <p>DHL will provide support, meanwhile BNPB will increase trucks and manpower to speed-up relief items mobilization. In addition, PT Pos Indonesia (Indonesian Post Company) will also support the process.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Port: <p>Pantoloan Port in Palu is operated by PELINDO (Indonesian Port Service). Road access to the port is passable but restricted by debris. The dock is able to provide limited operations. Ships that can be accommodated are roll-on/roll-off, ferry or general cargo ships with an onboard crane. Travel time by sea from Balikpapan is estimated at around 24-30 hours. There appear to be 3 forklifts at the port that are not currently operational due to lack of fuel.</p> <p><i>Sources: Directorate General of Customs and Excise in Indonesia AHA - Situation Update NO.7 (5 Oct. 2018)</i></p>

4	Establishment of a <u>ONE STOP SHOP</u>	YES
5	List of emergency relief consignments that will be cleared as a priority by Customs officials at entry point:	<p>Only 6 (six) types of goods that can be considered as relief resources from outside Indonesia as follows:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. electrical generators; 2. tents, shelter kits; 3. fogging equipment; 4. water treatment devices; 5. C-130 Hercules; 6. field hospitals <p>and cash relief.</p> <p>For the relief point (3) and (6), Ministry of Health limits the relief based on the needs in the disaster location. <u>The information related to the relief will be available at Ministry of Foreign Affairs.</u></p> <p>As long as the consignments points 1 - 6 (one to six) clearly does not related to prohibited and restricted goods determined by Customs Law, they can be sent to the entry point.</p> <p>Other needs are to be fulfilled from in-country resources.</p>
6	List of <u>CLEARING AGENTS</u>	Countries and organizations can freely choose the existing clearing agents through the representatives in the country where the goods are sent.
7	Provisions of the Customs Code related to <u>TAX EXEMPTION:</u> Procedure for tax exemption:	<p>Meanwhile regarding to customs regulations based on the Finance Ministerial Decree No. 69/PMK.04/2012 stated that import duty (taxes) will not be charged for goods that of disaster reliefs and or donations during the disaster emergency response period to the transition during emergency response to reconstruction and during the reconstruction period.</p> <p>In regard to the natural disaster happened in Palu, this disaster categorized as an “emergency disaster” so that Countries and organizations are required apply tax exemption by submitting list of goods to BNPB. After that, considering that list of goods, BNPB will publish tax exemption application to Head of Medium Customs Type B Customs and Excise Controlling and Servicing Office of Balikpapan (KPPBC Balikpapan) as the focal point at the Customs entry point.</p>

		The Indonesian Customs will support and provide accelerated services including import duty exemptions. For aircraft that will be in Indonesia for a while, can use the temporary import procedure (see point 10 below).
8	PRE-ARRIVAL clearance procedure:	<p>Every single donation be it from NGOs, Central Government and or District Government and or from International organisation must be submitted through The National Disaster Mitigation Agency (BNPB) and the organization must fill and apply for duty exemption forms <u>prior</u> to transporting the donations.</p> <p>BNPB on behalf of Importer is required to submit <u>an Arrival Plan of the Transportation of Goods (RKSP) and Inward Manifest to the Directorate General of Customs and Excise (DGCE).</u></p> <p>The main contact person for BNPB is Mr. Sutopo, Chief of Data and Information Center BNPB.</p>

10	TEMPORARY ADMISSION procedure:	<p>The above procedure is different for Temporary Admission. This procedure is considered as a special facility given for the natural disaster happened in Palu.</p> <p>However, the temporary admission is applied specifically for the aircraft relief that will be used in Indonesia temporarily.</p>

- **IMMIGRATION:**

In conform with the Presidential Decree No.21/2016 that as of March 2nd 2016, Indonesia has **exempted visa requirements to citizens of 169 nationalities** for only 30 days visit, non-extendable or convertible into another kind of stay permit.

The 169 countries, special administrative regions of a country, and entities are:
