

INDONESIA LOGISTICS CLUSTER – MEETING MINUTES

Padang

Date: 17th November, 2009-09:00-10:00h

Action Point:

1. Landslide data from District government development agency -BAPPEDA PARIAMAN- is to be circulated to cluster members.
2. Cluster members are to provide road blockage information via www.logcluster.org/ind09a or to Cluster Coordinator as and when necessary.
3. Holding a Logistics Cluster meeting in PARIAMAN office of CARE, to be discussed further.
4. IMC to provide GPS coordinates of landslide that occurred on 16 November, 2009 to cluster.
5. OCHA to provide brief notes/presentation on the mission to MALALAK for circulation to cluster members.

1 Introduction

Meeting opened with Introductions and **Update from the Cluster Coordinator**:

- Lisa Tonelli of CARE conveyed her apologies via the cluster coordinator. CARE has invited the Logistics Cluster hold a roving Logistics Cluster meeting at the CARE compound in PARIAMAN.
 - Date TBA.
- Cluster Coordinator(CC) asked people to add names to mailing list if new or tick attendance.
- The Cluster Coordinator tabled the Logistics Cluster's input to the Humanitarian Response Plan Monitoring Matrix: this will form the basis of materials for presentation to the multi-party Early Recovery meeting on Friday 20 November. This will also be the input to Early Recovery Strategic Framework being developed by Early Recovery Cluster and *will be merged with the government action plan for rehabilitation and reconstruction when published.*
 - On 20th November, the Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP) will be evaluated, and it is anticipated that IF PUBLISHED the *draft* GoI / West Sumatra Action Plan for Rehabilitation and Reconstruction will be reviewed.
 - The purpose of these reviews is to identify gaps in the transition through to early recovery and rehab / recon and propose appropriate coordination mechanisms to synchronise all actors.
 - Betty Ka is coming from Jakarta CO Logistics Cluster to attend the GoI/UN/NGO meeting on Friday 20th November 2009.
- WFP Logistics IM updated data on NFI and FI data, sourced from IOM trucking data base, disaggregated to sub-district level (where possible), noting that it should be finalised (up-to-date), by the end of this week: gina.meutia@wfp.org
- Paul Arbon is the Reports & Information: paul.arbon@wfp.org
- Cluster efforts to monitor Road Conditions was again raised – template on website www.logcluster.org/ind09a or direct to the Cluster Coordinator: agustina.tnunay@wfp.org

- Landslide data/roads data from BAPPEDA PARIAMAN will be provided to cluster members via the circulation list.
- Discussions have taken place between the Agriculture Cluster and Logistics Cluster regarding storage. However, no exact specifications regarding timeline or type of storage requirements have been provided.
- Shelter, WASH, Child Protection, and General Coordination meetings are held in PARIAMAN on a weekly basis. The schedule is available on www.sumatraearthquake.org under the Meetings tab.
- ETC report that the Radio Room is fully installed at the UN Joint Office and will be operational upon appointment of radio operators. (Satellite phones, (BGAN, Iridium) have yet to be activated.)
- Basic radio training is being provided by WFP / ETC cluster at the WFP office: 5pm weekdays and on weekends. Contact: ivan.klicko@wfp.org, patrick.thorden@wfp.org
- Three (3) Hubs operational:
 - Outer PADANG CITY: Three Mobile Storage Tent at Terminal Air Pacah, Jl. By Pass Padang Pariaman, Km. 12, Padang. (GAA (German NGO), MSF- Belgium, WFP) – 95% capacity.
 - PADANG CENTRAL CITY: One Mobile Storage at the Health Service (Dinas Kesehatan) Office, Jl. Perintis Kemerdekaan, Padang (medical supplies being used by the health service and WHO) - 95% capacity.
 - PARIAMAN: Two Mobile Storage Tents are operational at the Mayor's office compound in PARIAMAN city. (WFP and Yayasan Ibu (local NGO)) – 95% capacity.
 - 8 organisations in total are currently using the common storage space.
 - **NB: Operational Temporary storage common service will cease prior to 31 December 2009, as will all Logistics Cluster Operations.**

2 Round table – Agency update

Update from OXFAM:

- Around 7000 hygiene kits have been distributed along with 7000 buckets across the affected area. In addition, around 11000 Tarpaulins have been distributed as required: 2000 tarpaulins remain as locally held stock and will be distributed during the next few weeks.
- OXFAM is now beginning with its transitional shelter activities – areas being assessed.
- OXFAM's WASH activities include: building temporary latrines and rehabilitation of existing latrines, including some in Primary Schools.
 - OXFAM noted a lag in construction of these facilities owing to high demand for local contractors, and the lure of bigger projects for those contractors still available.
- OXFAM reported that some landslides due to heavy rain (LIMA) KOTA TIMUR caused delays with hygiene kit distributions over the past week.

Update from SC:

- Preparing partnership with IOM for distribution of approximately 10,000 hygiene kits & household kits. Commodities expected to arrive in PADANG in the coming two weeks for onward distribution in December in PARIAMAN/AGAM.
- SC will remain in PADANG until approximately March 2010, focussing its activities on protection (children) and transitional shelter.
- SC is exploring partnerships for its activities in education, child protection, and child friendly spaces, public health promotions, etc. These partnerships may be with other clusters, and/or, with government services.

Update from IOM:

- IOM's ECHO-funded common trucking service has made more than 2100 truck trips (within, and from outside of, West Sumatra): 7800MT has been transported as of November 15, 2009.
 - IOM has agreed to provide transport for ScF's commodities from JKT.
 - IOM has agreed to provide land haul for WFP's targeted supplementary food operation: inland to West Sumatra and on to FDP's in the 6 targeted districts.
- IOM has recruited 30 casual truck monitors who will escort its trucks over the coming month and verify deliveries to FDP's for WFP food distributions.
- During the last week IOM has contracted an average of 40 trucks per day, providing approx 250 MT capacity per day.
 - In the coming two weeks the fleet size will increase to approx. 50 plus trucks per day.
- IOM has created a map. Showing distribution breakdown by sub-district of NFI and FI across the affected area – to be posted on the www.sumatraearthquake.org and www.logcluster.org/ind09a . This is based on FDPs served by IOM trucking service.
- IOM trucking operations are currently scheduled to close 4 January 2010.
- Now that the emergency phase has concluded, IOM is having transit issues on certain roads owing to truck-size restrictions on certain provincial roads. IOM to provide details of locations, so that cluster can raise concerns with the authorities.

Update from IMC:

- IMC reported a landslide that occurred on 16 November 2009 causing a 3-hour delay as road was cleared.
 - Location: PADANG SAGO, PATAMUAN, PADANG PARIAMAN
 - IMC to send Exact GPS coordinates to be sent to Cluster.
 - IMC also noted that it's Mobile Clinic – in PATAMUAN – generally has no problems in accessing areas around PATIMUAN.

Update from WFP:

- Yayasan Ibu (YI) has been selected as WFP CP for PARIAMAN CITY, PDANG PARIAMAN and PASAMAN BARAT for distribution of biscuits and noodles to schools and Primary Health Care Centres.
- WFP will conduct direct distribution of biscuits and noodles for PADANG CITY, PESISIR SELATAN and AGAM.
 - All WFP distributions and CP distributions should be completed by end of December 2009.

Update from YAYASAN IBU (YI)

- Focussing on PARIAMAN, Yayasan Ibu is expanding distribution, as the Cooperating Partner (CP) for WFP's targeted supplementary food distributions.
 - YI is having difficulty in identifying road conditions in PARIAMAN BARAT.
- Some of the team have assessed roads in PASAMAN BARAT and PADADG PARIAMAN – updates needed
- Logistics and assessment of FDP's has identified schools that are known locally by other names– so naming data from provincial education service and district name is not standard.
 - Provincial Education Service advised cluster through the IM Network meeting on Tuesday 17th November, that district education offices would have the latest name changes: a product of regional autonomy.

Update from Shelter Cluster (SC)

- Attending most cluster meetings to keep abreast of clusters specific issues.

- Asked on behalf of other clusters, about better secondary roads data and maps. SC explained the difficulty of IDPs' locations and the prevalence of increased landslides on roads.
 - Latest road data is already available on Landslide Prone Areas and IDP's locations (recent checks with Public Works and Department of Mines and Energy and BNPB have not yielded newer versions of road data.)
 - All humanitarian actors are asked to inform Logistics Cluster of road blockages /issues via the www.logcluster.org/idn09a or directly to the Cluster Coordinator.

Update from OCHA

- OCHA/OXFAM went on field mission to MALALAK.
 - General comment: the degree of difficulty in accessing the area was obvious. During the trip the group had four stops – one camp – 18 tents (65 people- not including children) – the location is unsafe, their previous village was destroyed in previous landslide,
 - Other stop was only accessible by four wheel drive followed by a ten minute (1 km walk) – brief report from OCHA will be circulated by the Logistics Cluster circulation list.
 - People in Need were there working on temporary shelter. PMI has also established a presence and is supporting the settlements.
- One of the other two settlements, the PMI was providing water bladders and local NGOs were working through the Wali Nagari, who it seemed, was doing the camp management.
 - Perhaps need support from Oxfam or IOM or others to provide training in basic procedures, such as registration, etc.
 - All settlements lacked reliable sources of clean water and were relying on rain water harvesting. Latrine facilities were also lacking.
- Overall – basic humanitarian needs were being met.
