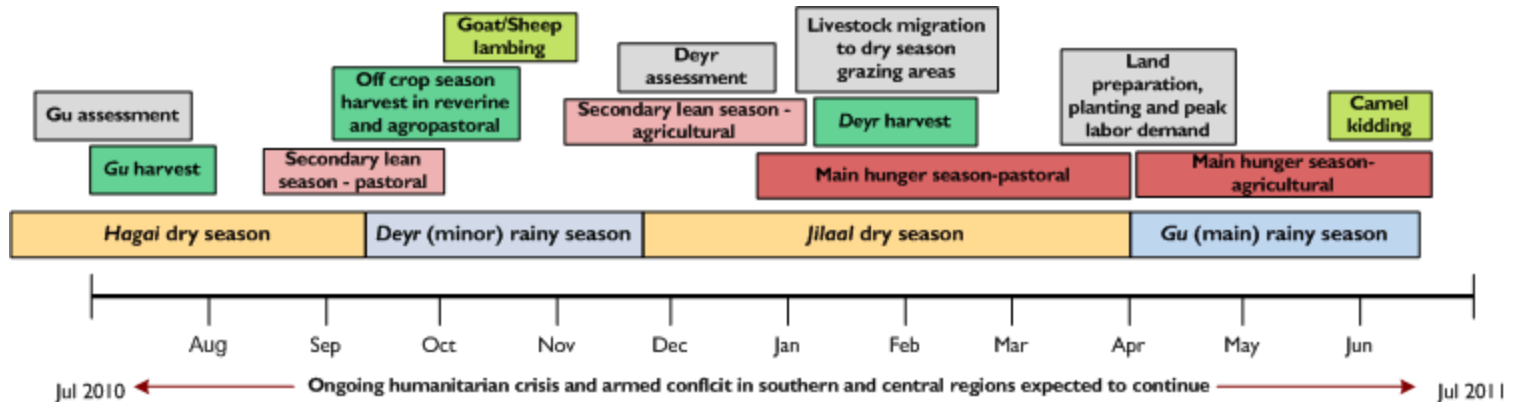

Weather - Road and Port Conditions in Somalia

Nov 29 2011



Road Updates

- **Garissa → Wajir → El Wak → Mandera** (slow truck movements due to poor road conditions) – Rains continuing on and off.
- **Mombasa → Dadaab → Kulan → Liboi → Dobley** (some vehicles stuck due to black cotton muddy road conditions)
- Discussion are on-going with transport companies to identify trucks suited for the current road conditions.
- **Dobley → Delivery Points (Shabah, Diff)** Continuing poor road conditions, slowing down deliveries, some vehicles stuck. (Seasonal River cutting off some roads).
- **El Wak to Delivery Points** (Slow deliveries due to muddy road conditions).



Road Updates (cont...)

- **Mogadishu → Baidoa** - Road is passable for all vehicles
- **Baidoa → Bakol Region** - Road is still not passable (Labatan Jirow, Wajid, Huddur, El Berde, Tayeglow)
- **Baidoa → Other Districts of Bay** - Road is still not passable (Qansaxdhere, Ufurow, Dinsor, Buale, Sakow, Salagle, Bardere, etc).
- **Mogadishu → Johwar and other North Districts** - Road is now passable (Jalaqsi, Beletweyne, and Galgadud Districts) .
- **Mogadishu → Merka, Jilib, Jamamae and Kismayo** - Road is passable.
- **Mogadishu → Awdhegle** - Road is still not passable.
- **Kismayo → Other South/West Districts** - Road is still not passable (Afmadow, Hagar, Badhadhe, etc)

Port Updates

Djibouti Port

- Djibouti Port is experiencing congestion at its bulk terminal, where the average waiting time for vessels is five days.

Mombasa Port

- Congestion issues in Mombasa Port are continuing, with delays in berthing and a significant number of vessels at anchorage. At present, average berthing times vary from five days (conventional vessels) to ten days (bulk vessels), depending on the time of arrival and vessel type/size.

Mogadishu Port

- No congestion. Average waiting times have decreased significantly; currently, there is a maximum waiting time of one day.

Northern Somalia Ports

- No congestion is being reported in Somalia's Northern Ports (Bossaso and Berbera).
