- The roles and responsibilities of the Logistics Cluster were explained.

Update on operations

- The Logistics Cluster has temporary storage space is available for use by the humanitarian community in ten facilities located in Sindh province (Karachi, Hyderabad, Sukkur, Badin, Nawabshah, Mithi, Mirpurkhas, Thatta, Sanghar, Umarkot). Requests forms for accessing common storage facilities are available at <http://www.logcluster.org/ops/pak09a/temporary-storage-request>. The storage space will initially be provided for six months and may be extended on a needs basis.
- The Logistics Cluster is able to provide road transport for interagency humanitarian cargo in response to requests. Request will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis.

AOB

- The Logistics Cluster is providing GIS/Mapping support to the humanitarian community. To date, several maps have been prepared and regularly updated for use by humanitarian actors. The Logistics Cluster can prepare maps for other humanitarian actors on request, with information provided.
- The Logistics Cluster is planning a GPS training in Hyderabad mid-November; any nominations are welcome. Further GPS trainings are planned for Badin and Sanghar at the end of November 2011.
- A comprehensive Warehousing training is also planned for mid-November; any nominations are welcome.
- Humanitarian actors on the ground were requested to share the pipeline situations. They were required to share feedback on the latest road conditions and ideas on alternate mode of transportation after the receding of the flood water.
