UNHAS Delivery of World Vision Relief Items in Sukkur (Sindh)

1 HIGHLIGHTS

- The Logistics Cluster is transporting relief items from several sectors together to support the Survival Strategy joint floods response initiative of UNICEF, WHO, WFP, UNFPA and partners in Sindh. The combined transport of items from various sectors facilitates joint distribution of complementary items (e.g. food, cooking sets, water purification tablets and jerry cans) together at the same time.
- The Logistics Cluster is training participants in emergency GPS skills. So far 50 staff of humanitarian organisations have been trained in Hyderabad and Gilgit. More trainings are planned in other cities. See *Mapping* section below.

2 AIR OPERATIONS

- Since air operations began on 5 August, the Logistics Cluster has coordinated airlift of 9,514 mt of relief cargo for 12 organisations in Pakistan. Of this 9,514 mt, 845 mt was delivered in the past week.

Sindh:

- UNHAS and the Pakistan Military continue to deliver relief items in Sindh, staging out of Nawabshah, Hyderabad, Dadu, Shahdadkot, and Sukkur.
- The US Military has ceased operations in Sindh, but continues to operate in KPK.
- In the past week, the Logistics Cluster facilitated air delivery of 251 mt of relief items to eight communities in Sindh. Overall in November, it is planned to deliver 1,500 mt of items by air in Sindh.
- Inter-agency assessments have identified landing zones for Survival Strategy deliveries in the Sehwan, Mancha Lake and Three Bunds areas.

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KPK):

- The Logistics Cluster is facilitating air deliveries to the following points:
 - **Kohistan:** Gabriel, Karang, Peach Bela, Shareed, Khotakot, Kuzparro, Gushali, Kareen, Totti.
 - **Swat:** Upper Balakot, Ultror and Kalam
- The NDMA has confirmed in writing that UNHAS may deploy one helicopter to serve isolated areas of KPK. Discussions are ongoing to determine operating / security procedures.

Gilgit-Baltistan:

- Currently there are no UNHAS operations in Gilgit, as delivery by road is possible. It may, however, be necessary to undertake air deliveries later, when snow blocks key roads.

3 STORAGE

- The Logistics Cluster continued to provide temporary storage in Peshawar, Besham, Khwazakhela, Sukkur, Chaklala, Hyderabad, Multan and Nawabshah. To date, 22 organisations have used storage services.

4 MAPPING

- The Logistics Cluster trained 50 staff from humanitarian organisations in Hyderabad and Gilgit in emergency GPS data collection and mapping skills. The trainings were conducted in both English and Urdu. It is planned to train an additional 104 persons in Peshawar, Multan, Sukkur and Islamabad. The training will improve the quality of road access data used by the humanitarian community and will make planning of landing zones for air deliveries more accurate. 5 ROAD UPDATES

KPK:

- Vehicles with a capacity up to 1.5 mt are accessing Kalam.
- The road to Kohistan District remains open.

Sindh:

- Flood waters are receding slowly. Many areas are not accessible even by tractor and trailer.
- The following roads are now open: (1) Jacobabad to Thul, (2) Dadu to Khairpur Nathan Shah, (3) Jacobabad to Garhi Khairo, (4) Shahdadkot to Garhi Khairo, (5) Jati to Batoro.
- The Dadu - Johi road is under 0.5 metres of water, but can be used by 4X4 vehicles or tractors.
- The road from Jati to Khorewah is blocked.
- Qubo Saeed Khan can be reached by 4x4 from Shahdadkot, or by light trucks using the Imam Bux Jamali road.
