

Background

In an effort to have an overview of the impact of COVID-19 on Humanitarian Supply Chains in the world, the Logistics Cluster is compiling updates on entry point for cargo. The table below reflects updates received from other organisations and the private sector. As per the Logistics Cluster mandate, the information gathered focuses only on cargo transport, not passengers' restrictions. Also note that this list is not exhaustive and will be updated based on the information received on a day-to-day basis.

Afghanistan	Chaman border closed until 29 April.	23 March	WFP
Belize	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements.	23 March	WFP
Cameroon	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements, particularly with Chad and Central African Republic. Reported border closure with Gabon.	23 March	Republic of Cameroon, WFP
Central African Republic	Commercial transport can cross the border from Cameroon.	25 March	WFP
Colombia	Border with Venezuela closed. Humanitarian cargo exceptions might be made through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Border to Ecuador remains open but transporter must be quarantined for 14 days upon return.	25 March	WFP
Cuba	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements.	23 March	WFP
Chad	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements.	23 March	WFP
Djibouti	Humanitarian and cargo flights are not interrupted. Ports are asking to submit documents on last 10 ports calls for all vessels 72 hours before arrival.	23 March	WFP
Dominican Republic	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements.	25 March	WFP
Guinee-Bissau	Closure of all land, air and sea transport excluding medical and food imports of basic needs.	23 March	WFP

Haiti	Border with Dominican Republic remains open for cargo movements.	23 March	WFP
Honduras	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements. Equipment for hospital use and/or medicines donations arriving at San Pedro Sula Airport must have an authorization from the National Risk Management System 24h before arrival.	25 March	WFP
Ecuador	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements.	23 March	WFP
Egypt	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements. Increased checks and measures at entry points.	25 March	WFP
India	Exports to Bangladesh, Nepal and Buthan are still possible.	17 March	Agility
Jordan	Jordanian trucks are not allowed to cross to Syria.	23 March	Jordanian Ministry of Transport
Kenya	Port restrictions for ships from Asia.	23 March	WFP
Lebanon	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements.	23 March	Logistics Cluster
Madagascar	Sea ports remain open to for cargo only.	23 March	WFP
Palestine	All humanitarian and commercial cargo movements allowed.	25 March	WFP
Panama	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements.	20 March	WFP
Peru	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements. Custom working on limited capacities.	24 March	Peruvian Ministry of Transport and Communications
Rwanda	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements.	23 March	WFP
South Africa	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements.	23 March	WFP
South Sudan	Cargo flights are allowed. Only trucks carrying food and fuel are permitted to cross land borders.	25 March	WFP
Sudan	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements.	23 March	WFP
Syria	Damascus, Aleppo and Qamishli airports are operating only for domestic cargo movements, no flights from outside the country. Lattakia and Tartous port are operating for cargo movements.	24 March	Logistics Cluster

Togo	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements. Stripping of containers at the port are suspended until further notice.	23 March	WFP
Uganda	Only cargo flights allowed in the country.	23 March	WFP
Venezuela	Cargo planes are allowed, and commercial trade continue with Brazil on land border. Seaports remain open.	25 March	Logistics Cluster
Yemen	Humanitarian cargo flights will be rescheduled but will continue to operate. Ports are open with quarantines for cargo and crew.	25 March	International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO), WFP
