

## Background

In an effort to have an overview of the impact of COVID-19 on Humanitarian Supply Chains in the world, the Logistics Cluster is compiling updates on entry point for cargo. The table below reflects updates received from other organisations and the private sector. As per the Logistics Cluster mandate, the information gathered focuses only on cargo transport, not passengers' restrictions. Also note that this list is not exhaustive and will be updated based on the information received on a day-to-day basis.

Afghanistan	Chaman border is closed until 29 April. Border with China is closed. The border with Iran has been re-opened.	26 March	WFP
Algeria	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements, but operating at reduced capacity, delays to be expected.	26 March	WFP Agility

North Korea	Cargo entering from Dalian, China at Nampo port.	26 March	WFP
Oman	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements.	29 March	DHL
Palestine	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements.	25 March	WFP
Pakistan	All humanitarian and commercial cargo movements allowed but operating at lower efficiency.  Cross border <b>land</b> freight only for food and essential items. Customs operating at lower efficiency.	26 March	WFP Agility
Panama	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements.	20 March	WFP
Paraguay	Only authorized cargo can cross border with Brazil.	26 March	WFP
Peru	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements, but operating at reduced capacity, delays to be expected. Custom working on limited capacities.  Internal cargo movement is restricted.	24 March	Peruvian Ministry of Transport and Communications Agility
Philippines	Davao airport only accepting humanitarian and essential good.  Cebu Island and Cebu province remain open to all cargo movements.	27 March	Agility
Rwanda	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements.	23 March	WFP
Saudi Arabia	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements.	27 March	DHL
Serbia	Entry restrictions apply to truck drivers from Italy, Switzerland, Romania, Spain, France, Germany, Austria, Slovenia and Greece, which are required to quarantine upon arrival or may be rejected from entering altogether. For the trucks transiting through the country drivers are obliged to leave the country within 12 hours.	27 March	DHL

Somalia	<p><b>Sea transport</b> to all key supply ports accessible.</p> <p><b>Air transport</b> out of Nairobi to Somalia <b>ONLY</b> possible for WFP/UNHAS with special approvals.</p> <p><b>Internal air</b> transport not restricted.</p>	26 March	WFP
South Africa	<p>Cross-border land freight restricted to food and essential items, delays to be expected.</p> <p>Air and sea freight management operating at lower efficiency.</p>	23 March	WFP Agility
South Sudan	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements.	25 March	Logistics Cluster
Sudan	<p>Port Sudan remains open.</p> <p>Land transport to South Sudan is still possible.</p>	23 March	WFP
Syria	<p>Damascus, Aleppo and Qamishli <b>airports</b> are operating only for domestic cargo movements, no flights from outside the country.</p> <p>Lattakia and Tartous <b>ports</b> are operating for cargo movements.</p> <p>Working hours at points of entry have reduced.</p>	26 March	Logistics Cluster
Tanzania	All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements.	26 March	WFP
Togo	<p>All commercial borders are still open to cargo movements.</p> <p>Stripping of containers at the port are suspended until further notice.</p>	23 March	WFP
Venezuela	<p>Cargo <b>flights</b> are allowed.</p> <p>Commercial trade continue with Brazil on <b>land</b> border.</p> <p><b>Seaports</b> remain open.</p>	25 March	Logistics Cluster
Yemen	<p>Humanitarian cargo <b>flights</b> are allowed.</p> <p><b>Ports</b> are open with quarantines for cargo and crew.</p>	25 March	International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO), WFP
