1. Situation Update

- Hurricane Irma, a Category 5 storm, passed north of Cuba on 9 September 2017 and is currently running north heading towards Florida where is expected to make landfalls on the afternoon of 10 September 2017.
- The Global Logistics Cluster (GLC) is liaising with its partners in order to map potential needs and logistics bottlenecks in the affected areas; also, a Logistics Officer has arrived to Port-au-Prince, Haiti, on 8 September.
- A Logistics Cluster meeting took place in Port-au-Prince on 9 September. Nine attendees (Care, IOM, MAF, Oxfam x2 (local + regional), Save, Solidarites, Unicef, WFP). The partners reported that no emergency nor rapid response is ongoing apart from increasing pipelines for normal operations. The GLC will reinitiate the Logistics Sector Working Group on Preparedness activities. Organisations interested in having more details, to contact Fahmeem.Araie@wfp.org or hq_im_rome@wfp.org.
- On Friday, 8 September 2017, the MAF team in Haiti completed an aerial survey over the northern part of the country, which was hardest hit by Hurricane Irma. No major damage of these areas has been reported. The images taken on the survey flight are displayed in a Google Earth (kmz) file accessible at this [link](#) (open in Google Earth to view. Once zoomed in a bit, click on a “stack” of images and it will expand to show the images with lines pointing to the specific GPS locations) and on the [Preparedness Platform](#) (go to the Haiti tab). The summary report from MAF is distributed together with these minutes.
- Organisations are invited to keep the Logistics Cluster updated with all available information in terms of access and available assets in the affected countries. Organisations are also invited to share the minutes with the colleagues on the ground, communicating also that a mailing list at field level has been restored and those interested to be included in the list to contact Fahmeem.Araie@wfp.org or hq_im_rome@wfp.org.
- Following updates on airport situations as of 9 September, Haiti airports have resumed normal operations. Further airport updates from OCHA can be found at the end of these minutes.
- With the LET, the Logistics Cluster was looking into an option to move cargo on a free-to-user basis from Europe to a destination in the Caribbean depending on needs. At the moment there has not been sufficient requests, so this option is not being pursued. If the needs of the organisations change they should contact HQ_IM_Rome@wfp.org by Tuesday 12 September 2017, 16:00 CEST.
- GLC is calling upon partners to indicate interest in cargo opportunities, potentially free to user, from Panama to one of the affected areas. Interest as well as information on destination, volume and weight of cargo, should be indicated to HQ_IM_Rome@wfp.org.
- Fuel Relief Fund ready to support in the US.

- OFDA reported they have 15 containers arriving in Haiti on 11/09/2017. Additionally OFDA is airlifting 72MT of relief items to Antigua and 32MT to the Bahamas.
- Partners indicated Delta airlines are looking at possibly providing free airlift out of the US. Further information is still to be gathered.
- UNICEF is waiting for assessment reports on Antigua, which will be shared once available. UNICEF is also planning to move supplies from Panama to affected areas.
- Partners have indicated rumours on a military vessel to sail for the Caribbean and the request to add cargo if possible. The Logistics Cluster has not received information on this topic at this stage.
- ECHO has deployed a Logistics Coordinator to Santo Domingo.
- THW staff deploying under UNDAC for Jamaica has been delayed in transfer flights.
- Precise figures on people and villages affected will be shared with partners once confirmed.
