1. Announcements

- Participants were informed that all Logistics Cluster warehouses will be closed on Friday, 30 October 2015, for the monthly physical inventory.
- Participants were also informed that the Logistics Cluster will be deactivated in Liberia on 15 December 2015.

2. Open Floor Discussion

- Organisations were informed that the Logistics Cluster will continue to facilitate the distribution of PPEs in collaboration with the Ministry of Health (MoH) & WHO. The Logistics Cluster will also continue the plan of handing over all logistics bases to the Government of Liberia and will deactivate its activities by mid-December.
- Rider SCM, an organisation providing maintenance and repair services for all MoH vehicles in the 15 counties of Liberia, reported some challenges on road accessibility in rural areas. This organisation is requesting a 40 or 20 feet container for storing spare parts. Rider SCM has established five hubs in the North, East, South and South East of the country and is providing fuel to the health teams in all the counties. They are seeking to lend or lease a tanker to store fuel for distribution in the counties.
- The Logistics Cluster Coordinator reiterated that the Logistics Cluster has phased out all free-to-user services and only provides information sharing as of 30 September 2015.
- Oxfam announced that it is closing down all projects in Nimba and Zwedru and opening another office in River Cess County. Oxfam also announced that it is transferring from emergency to development phase.
- The General Services Agency (GSA) attendees presented some points related to the transition and transfer of WFP logistics hubs to GSA.
