1. Access

- As accessibility is evolving quickly, the delivery modalities are adapting to ensure the maximum efficiency of the response. The Logistics Cluster will advise on the most efficient means of transportation based on locations and priorities.
- The priority sectors defined by the Operational and Strategic Team led by the Government are Food, Health, WASH and Shelter.
- Road Access:
 - Guara-Guara is now accessible by road.
 - Buzi north remains difficult to access but accessibility is expected to improve quickly. It has been reported that the road is already passable for specific vehicles.
 - An assessment is ongoing to evaluate the accessibility Mutichara.
 - Partners are strongly encouraged to share all access constraints their field teams can collect to ensure that the [Access Constraint Map](#) is as accurate as possible. Real time information is critical for the precision of the information.

2. Air Operation

- The Logistics Cluster has started to facilitate the civilian-military consolidation of humanitarian cargo from Maputo to Beira with a C-130 aircraft.
- The Logistics Cluster continues to support with offloading of incoming cargo at Beira airport. Organisations are requested to share their movements request ahead of time and to submit a [Service Request Form](#).

3. Storage

- The Logistics Cluster set up a Mobile Storage Unit (MSU) in Buzi north to provide temporary storage services to partners, the MSU is managed by IFCR.
- An assessments is ongoing to set up two MSUs in Namathanda, one for Concern WorldWideand another for Inter-Agency use managed by CW.

4. Customs

- The final approval from the government concerning the blanket waiver is pending approval.

The next Logistics Cluster coordination meeting will be 5 April at 17:00 at the emergency operations centre at the airport.
