1. Road Access and Constraints

2. Common Services Updates

- As partners have been confirming that there are currently no gaps in transport nor storage in Beira, and that the private sector can cope with the current storage and road transport needs, the Logistics Cluster confirmed jointly with partners the closure of common services in Beira from 30 June onward.
- In addition to service providers available on the local market, WFP Bilateral Logistics Service Provision in Mozambique could also act as service provider of choice to humanitarian organisations for port operations and cargo transport and storage. Conditions of services provided would be on full cost-recovery basis. WFP Head of Supply Chain may be contacted for more information. The Logistics Cluster can share the contact details to interested partners.
- The Logistics Cluster encourages partners to visit the Mozambique Logistics Capacity Assessment (LCA) available at <https://dlca.logcluster.org/display/DLCA/Mozambique>. Partners agreed to share any relevant logistical information they might have.
