1. Situation Update

- The road from Chimoio to Espungabera remains difficult to access, especially from Dombe to Espungabera.
- Organizations to submit [Service Request Forms](#) for common storage service at the Logistics Cluster warehouse and inform 24h before arrival of the cargo.

2. Common Services

Air Transport

- No Jet A-1 fuel available in Chimoio.
- Cargo aircraft from to Chimoio will terminate by the 12 of April. Organisations wanting to send cargo from Maputo to Chimoio and/or Beira are invited to send their [Service Request Forms](#) before Wednesday 10 April to the Logistics Cluster.

Warehouse/Cold Chain

- The common storage warehouse in Chimoio is still operational for all the partners, but the capacity is becoming limited, due to slow release of stored items from the warehouse. The Logistics Cluster is strongly encouraging partners to work with their counterparts on creating a distribution pipeline and facilitating the flow of cargo from the warehouse to beneficiaries.
- Organizations must inform the Logistics Cluster focal point 24 hours prior deliveries or collection at the warehouse and specify whether they will need extra offloading capacities.

Road Transport/Access

- Commercial companies are providing transport services to most locations surrounding Chimoio. More information on suppliers can be found on the [Logistics Capacity Assessment webpage](#). Information on daily rate are also available on the LCA page.

3. Partners Updates and Constraints

- MSF is using the storage facilities to store their medical (non- cold chain items) and water and sanitation items. Most of the currently stored items should be dispatched in the coming weeks and more items will be arriving to replenish the stocks.
- Swiss Humanitarian Aid will work with MSF on a potential donation of the water and sanitation items that are currently stored in the Logistics Cluster warehouse. SHA has also offered support to UNFPA regarding the transportation of the dignity kits from the Logistics Cluster warehouse to Donba.
- UNICEF is working with their partners on the distribution plan and the NFIs currently stored in the warehouse will be distributed next week. The Logistics Cluster has also received 13 mt of nutritional supplements from UNICEF that is stored in the Logistics Cluster warehouse. UNICEF also informed the Logistics Cluster that with the new school season the educational materials will be arriving and will require temporary storage facilities prior to the distributions.

The next Logistics Cluster coordination meeting in Chimoio is scheduled for Monday 15 April at 09:00 at the WFP Office.
