1. Common Services

Storage

- The Logistics Cluster has storage capacities available in Chimoio and Beira.
- The Logistics Cluster is strongly encouraging partners to share their pipelines in advance.
- Organisations to submit [Service Request Forms](#) for common storage service at the Logistics Cluster warehouse and inform 24h before ETA (Estimated Time of Arrival) of the cargo.

Road Transport/Access

- The Lucita river bridge has been repaired and is now accessible.
- Access is improving in most major roadways, interior roads within districts remain inaccessible. For instance, in Sofala province several secondary roads have been washed away or cut off in Nhamatanda, Buzi and Chibababva districts.
- Road assessments are ongoing in Chinde and Buzi areas. Following heavy rains from 17 April, road access has reduced considerably, and new assessments may need to be carried out.
- Accessibility to South Buzi is now improving.
- The road from Chimoio to Dombe is accessible to trucks up to 10 mt.

2. Partners Updates and Constraints

- Swiss Humanitarian Aid is working with Solidarities International for the cleaning of wells in Buzi.
- UNICEF is checking this week if more supplies are in the pipeline for the WASH Cluster, that would be stored temporarily at the Logistics Cluster warehouse in Chimoio.
- UNDAC shared the cyclone alert that is expected for 23 – 26 April (Northern Mozambique / Tanzania) information has been shared with all organisations.
- All the organisations requested that the Logistics Cluster meeting should be carried out now fortnightly (every two weeks).

The next Logistics Cluster coordination meeting in Chimoio is scheduled for Monday 06 May at 9:00 at the WFP Office.
