## 1. Access Constraints

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- Partners are strongly encouraged to share all access constraints their field teams can collect to ensure that the Access Constraints Map is as accurate as possible. Real time information is critical for ensuring the accuracy of the information.
- The road from Maputo to Beira, and from Maputo to Chimoio are both fully accessible.
- The road N280 connecting Beira and north Buzi is open for all vehicle types up to Guaraguara. Transport from Beira to Buzi has to be organized by road.
- The road connecting south of Buzi to Guaraguara remains difficult to pass, it is passable only for 4x4 trucks up to 10 mt.

## 2. Air Transport and Storage Capacities

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- **Air Operations**

- USAID is operating an airbridge between Maputo and Beira and making available to the humanitarian community two C-130 aircrafts (capacity 12-15 mt). The Logistics Cluster team is collecting [SRFs](#) from partners to move their cargo on these two aircrafts.
- These aircraft will only be available for a limited time and as such, partners are requested to urgently inform the Logistics Cluster of foreseen requirements to ensure appropriate planning over the next few days in order to maximise the remaining rotations.
- Should partners need guidance for offloading/uploading cargo at Maputo airport, they can contact UNHAS focal point in Maputo, [German Puente](#).
- Partners are requested to share the relevant documentation at the airport (SRF and waybills) with the transporter.
- Should partners require any additional transport services from Beira airport, they are encouraged to contact the Logistics Cluster team in Beira. The contact details are available on the [website](#).

- **Storage**

- Should partners require any additional transport and/or storage services, they should send a filled in Service Request form ([SRF](#)) to this [email address](#).

## 3. Customs

- The final approval from the government concerning the blanket waiver is pending approval.
