1. Road Access and Constraints

- Partners were invited to communicate with each other regarding planned truck movements into affected areas to avoid congesting the area with too many trucks and degrading the road conditions.
- Partners were invited to share information they have on road access with the Logistics Cluster. The latest Access Constraints map can be found on the Logistics Cluster website [here](#).
- Partners reported that the roads to Quissanga, Macomia, Chiure, Mocimboa da Praia, Montepuez, Ancuabe, Metuge and Mecufi are accessible for 10 mt trucks.

2. Common Services Updates

- Partners were reminded of the need to submit a correctly completed Service Request Form (SRF) to mozambique.clustercargo@wfp.org to access Logistics Cluster common services. Instructions on how to complete the form can be found [here](#).

Air Operations

- Partners were requested to provide their SRFs for air transport of cargo as far as possible in advance to assist with the Logistics Cluster's operational planning.
- The Logistics Cluster advised partners to continue to check the [Landing Zones map](#) on the website for the most up-to-date information about where goods can be airlifted to.
- UNHAS has made one 10 pax capacity Caravan aircraft available until 9 June to assist in the transport of humanitarian workers to affected areas, with flights currently available to Ibo and Matemo Islands. Partners who wish to book flights should submit the necessary information to moz.unhas@wfp.org, copying mozambique.clustercargo@wfp.org, by 14:00 on the day before flying.
- One Mi8 helicopter will remain available to the humanitarian community until 7 June to ensure urgent cargo reaches areas that remain inaccessible by road. Any further possible extension beyond this date depends on the availability of funds and on partners' requests.

Storage

- The Logistics Cluster common storage in Pemba still has space available for partners. Partners should submit an SRF to mozambique.clustercargo@wfp.org if they wish to store their goods. There is also currently space available in the containers at the airport for cargo that is to be airlifted.
- The Mobile Storage Units (MSU) on Ibo Island and in Macomia have been erected and partners were reminded that they are now available for use by the humanitarian community. Those interested should submit an SRF.
- A third MSU will be erected in Mucojo and partners will be advised about its availability in due course.

Sea Operations

- The contract for the 60 mt vessel has been finalised and the customs documents are now under review at Maputo level. Partners will be advised as soon as the vessel becomes available to serve Ibo, Matemo and Mucojo.
- In the meantime, discussions are underway regarding the potential use by partners of the boat used by ICRC to reach Mucojo. The Logistics Cluster will advise partners of the outcome of these discussions.

Road Transport

- Partners were reminded that the Logistics Cluster is able to assist with road transport if needed. Requests should be sent to mozambique.clustercargo@wfp.org.
- The Logistics Cluster is evaluating the availability and capacity of road transporters in Mucojo and Pemba and will share this information with partners.

3. Partner Updates

- Caritas won't erect an MSU on an island, north of Pemba, where IRIS used to have a storage facility.
- Caritas, IFRC, UNFPA and UNICEF informed the Logistics Cluster about their pipeline and confirmed that they had consignments to be stored in the Logistics Cluster common storage facility to be erected in Mucojo.
- Partners enquired about Logistics Cluster activities in Chimoio and whether coordination meetings will be reintroduced due to the increase in activities in recent months. The Logistics Cluster informed the partners that coordination and common services activities have been scaled down in Chimoio for the time being but that the new Logistics Cluster coordinator will review the situation and decide if there is a need to reintroduce a cluster presence.
- WHO informed attendees that the cholera vaccination campaign will take place from 17 to 21 June in Pemba, Mecuje and Mecufi.
- The UNICEF centre of operations will be based in Beira and will be covering Pemba and Chimoio as well.
- Caritas is following up about a shipment of tarpaulins from the Logistics Cluster warehouse in Beira to Caritas warehouse in Pemba.

The next Logistics Cluster coordination meeting will be held on 10 June at 16:00 at the INGC Compound.
