1. SITUATION UPDATE

- The Logistics Cluster will continue to support partners through increased assessments of commercial capacities in the affected areas including warehousing, transport and general suppliers.
- The Logistics Cluster will continue to build capacity and transfer knowledge through briefings and hands-on courses. The Logistics Cluster has so far conducted sessions on Health and Safety measures in relief operations, Data collection through GPS, NFI management in warehouses, Generator use & maintenance, and warehouse management. Sessions on First Aid and Logistics Cluster SOPs are planned.
- The Logistics Cluster has stopped providing transport services to partners on the 15 February.
- The Logistics Cluster will continue to provide temporary storage at the following locations until the following dates:
 - Ormoc – 28 February 2014
 - Cebu – 28 February 2014
 - Roxas – 28 February 2014
 - Tacloban – 31 March 2014
 - Guiuan - 30 April 2014

2. AOB

- UNFPA is looking for storage space in Cebu for their cargo. LWR/Act Alliance and UNFPA will speak bilaterally on the possibility of renting a storage space together. The Logistics Cluster has provided details of warehouses in Cebu to UNFPA but they are much bigger than their requirement.
- Samaritans Purse is looking for storage space in Cebu to store medicines. The Logistics Cluster will provide Samaritans Purse with contact details for WHO in order for them to access information on such storage space.
- IVDR is looking for storage space in Ormoc. The Logistics Cluster will share the details of its coordinator in that region, Peter Holtsberg, with IVDR after the meeting.
- IOM asked the Logistics Cluster for the possibility of loaning out 50 plastic pallets to them. The Logistics Cluster will get back to IOM on this request.
- On the 15 of February, UNHAS ceased its free passenger service.
- UNHAS is currently working on an agreement with a local operator for ad-hoc flights and would be finalised in few days. The service will be provided for passenger and cargo movement, Medevac, assessments on full cost recovery basis. The aircraft will be positioned in Manila and the notice period for all the services except for medevac will be four days. For Medevac, a doctor's certificated permitting flying will be required.
- The next Logistics Cluster meeting will be held on Friday, 28 February 2014.
