## 1. Operational Update

- The Logistics Cluster continues to facilitate common storage and transport services as well as chartered cargo receptions at Rubkona Airfield for all humanitarian partners operating in Bentiu to support the ongoing humanitarian response activities at the UNMISS Protection of Civilian Site (POC), and in Bentiu town and its surroundings.
- Air Operations:
  - The Logistics Cluster facilitated the reception of four cargo flights on behalf of organisations operating in Bentiu during January 2019.
  - Partners' cargo waybills, manifests or packing lists must be signed by the appropriate authorities in Juba (South Sudan aviation authorities and National security).
  - Organisations must notify the Logistics Cluster at least three days in advance for charter air cargo reception support.
- Common Transport Service (CTS):
  - More than 285 mt of food and Non-Food Items (NFIs) were moved by CTS trucks in December from the Humanitarian Logistics Base to various locations.
  - All four CTS truck in Bentiu are in good working condition.
  - Organisations must issue a waybill to the driver for each CTS trip. The information on the waybill should correspond with the details on the Service Request Form (SRF).
  - Partners must submit their requests for assistance by 14:00 on the day prior to requiring CTS support.
- Common Storage Facilities:
  - The Logistics Cluster supports humanitarian agencies with access to common storage services in Bentiu. Over the past month, more than 70 mt of food and NFIs were received into common storage.
  - There is currently 120 m<sup>2</sup> of indoor storage and 120 m<sup>2</sup> of outdoor storage available to partners. To access this, organisations must submit an SRF.
  - Re-stacking, segregation of unusable items and cleaning work at the outdoor storage has been ongoing to create more space for incoming cargo.
- Western Corridor Convoy Coordination:
  - The convoy that departed Juba on 25 January for Bentiu and other locations has not yet arrived. It is expected to arrive over or during the weekend.

- Beyond Bentiu Response (BBR)
  - The Logistics Cluster supports the BBR with transportation of food and NFIs. In January, four BBR missions carrying over 16 mt of Food and Non-Food Items were supported.
  - Organisations are requested to send an SRF one week in advance for Logistics Cluster CTS support for BBR locations.

### 3. Access Constraints

- Bentiu to Mayom road is passable.
- Bentiu to Kaljack road is passable.
- Bentiu to Guit main road is passable.
- Bentiu to Nimni road is passable.
- Bentiu to Kuach road is passable.
- Bentiu to Nhialdiu road is passable. The road has recently been repaired by UNMISS engineers.
- Bentiu to Koch road is passable but with potholes.
- Bentiu to Panakuach road is passable.
- Bentiu to Pariang - Yida road is passable through Panakuach Junction
- Koch Town to Patit to Ngoiny-Bieh road is passable.
- Bentiu-Leer road is currently not passable. UNMISS Horizontal Mobility Engineering Company has been working on repairing the road. Completion is expected in 2-3 weeks.
- All roads from Bentiu to BBR areas are accessible. Only Leer, Cadet in Guit and Boaw in Koch are not accessible due to shrubs and deep potholes.

### 3. AOB

- The Ministry of Health advised partners to report expired drugs for verification and/or disposal. It was suggested that organisations perform a joint disposal of expired drugs.
