1. Air Operations Updates

- The Logistics Cluster transported over 150 mt of cargo by air ex-Bor in February, reaching 20 field locations in Greater Jonglei and Eastern Upper Nile locations on behalf of 15 organisations.

2. ICWG Priority Locations and Flood Response Updates

- Partners were reminded that priority locations are defined by the Inter-Cluster Coordination Group (ICCG) at national level, and all requests to prioritise locations for cargo delivery by air should be made to relevant cluster leads.
- The Logistics Cluster advised partners that locations which cannot be reached by road or river can be supported by air from either Juba or Bor. Organisations in doubt of where to preposition cargo should contact the Logistics Cluster team: southsudan.clustercargo@wfp.org.

3. Barge Movement

- Barge #4 is scheduled to depart early March for New Fangak and Old Fangak.
- Barge #5 is scheduled to depart during the first week of April, delivering cargo to New Fangak, Malakal, Melut, Kodok and Renk.
- The next boat movement to Ayod and Old Fangak is planned to depart end of March.

4. Physical Access Constraints/Road Conditions

- The latest Access Constraints Map has been published on the Logistics Cluster Website. The map reflects physical access information received from partners at county and state level and can be found [here](#).
- Juba-Bor road is open and accessible for all vehicle types including heavy trucks (capacity of 40 mt and over). The transit time is estimated at 36 hours (less than two-day trip), depending on the type of vehicle used.
- WFP road assessment missions are ongoing to determine the physical condition of all roads in Greater Jonglei.

5. AOB

- Participants were informed that warehouse space is available at the common storage site in Bor and organisations can contact the Logistics Cluster team to request storage service.
- Organisations were reminded that a fleet of three Common Transport Services (CTS) trucks is available to support short-distance transport needs. Please note that prior notice of 24 hours is required for any transport request. The trucks will only support cargo movements within Bor town and surrounding areas.
- Partners were informed that service request procedures remain the same for cargo to be transported by river and air. Organisations wishing to transport relief items to response locations are requested to submit [Service Request Forms \(SRFs\)](#) to southsudan.clustercargo@wfp.org.
