1. Logistics Cluster Operational Update

- The Logistics Cluster Wau currently has three UN-plated Common Transport Service (CTS) trucks and 3 back-up Government of South Sudan (GOSS) plated CTS trucks. Only UN-plated CTS trucks are assigned to the Beyond Wau Response (BWR), while the 3 GOSS-plated trucks remain on standby at the Logistics Cluster Base for any cargo transport within Wau town.
- Organisations were encouraged to submit SRFs for upcoming responses as early as possible to assist the Logistics Cluster given that there are multiple responses ongoing.
- Areas affected by conflict remain as priority locations. The Logistics Cluster urged organisations to continue prepositioning cargo in locations along the Western Corridor (Tonj, Kuajok, Wunrock, Aweil and Twic) and using the Logistics Cluster-coordinated convoy along this route
- UNICEF is planning to send nutrition items from Wau to Bor Medina through the Logistics Cluster. The cluster and IOM will first confirm the safety of the road from Raja to Bor Medina. The request for this movement is in progress.
- Johanniter International would like to transport its cargo from Wau to Juba using the Western Corridor Convoy. They requested Logistics Cluster support for when the convoy reaches Wau.
- The Logistics Cluster informed organisations that they will no longer need to pay the cluster porters for charter flight receptions at the Wau airport. This is now considered part of their regular duties.
- The Logistics Cluster requested that Protection Of Civilian site food distribution partners keep the Logistics Cluster informed about their distributions in this area in case there are challenges in transporting remaining food back to the WFP warehouse.
- The Logistics Cluster requested that organisations currently storing expired food items in the warehouse to dispose of these stocks as soon as possible to make room for more cargo arriving via the Western Corridor convoys.
- The Logistics Cluster will offer a training on correctly completing SRFs in advance of the upcoming Bagari, Basia, Baselia, Deim Zubeir, and Faajallah responses.

2. Access Constraints

- Access to areas of high humanitarian need have been granted to the humanitarian community through OCHA till end of February.

This includes:
