


Highlights:

- On 19 September, an inter-agency convoy to Aleppo Governorate was damaged in a security incident. Several casualties among the convoy drivers and Syrian Arab Red Crescent (SARC) staff were sustained.
- A total of nine Inter-Agency Humanitarian Convoys to besieged and hard-to-reach locations inside Syria in September were coordinated by the Logistics Cluster, in close collaboration with SARC and OCHA.
- Much needed humanitarian supplies were transported to these areas on behalf of IOM, UNFPA, UNICEF, WFP and WHO.



Transport and Storage

Storage by item type (m³) - September 2016



- In September 2016, as part of the Inter-Agency Humanitarian Convoys, over 5,108 m³ of relief cargo was transported to several hard-to-reach and besieged locations in Aleppo, Hama, Homs, Idleb and Rural Damascus governorates, including WASH, Nutrition, Education, Protection, Food, Health and Shelter items.
- The Logistics Cluster has also facilitated the delivery of 881.58 m³ of much needed Food, Health, WASH, Shelter and Education supplies to Qamishli as part of the Damascus-Qamishli airlift operation in September, on behalf of UNHCR, WFP and WHO.
- 94 m² of cargo belonging to UNICEF, ICRC and WHO including medical kits, batteries, tomato paste and water purification tablets has been delivered to Deir Ezzor as part of WFP's airdrop operation between April and September 2016.
- During the reporting period, the Logistics Cluster stored 3,982 m³ of newly received humanitarian goods in common storage facilities in Homs, Qamishli, Tartous and Rural Damascus on behalf of FAO, IOM, Oxfam and WHO.

Coordination & Information Management

- Logistics Cluster coordination meetings are regularly held in Damascus, Amman and Gaziantep and are regularly attended by key humanitarian actors, in order to discuss logistics bottlenecks and develop common solutions for improved humanitarian response.
- Logistics coordination meetings are also held in Beirut on a bi-monthly basis.
