Situation Update

- OCHA presented an overview of the Access Monitoring Reporting Format (AMRF), aimed at collecting information on access constraints and their impact on humanitarian action, and formal or informal policies that restrict access. In order to provide inputs regarding access, focal points for each agency will be appointed. All incidents related to access among should be reported to the respective focal point.

Access Constraints

- Hodeidah port is currently congested operating with 5 vessels at berth, 23 at anchorage and 10 more expected.
- Aden Airport is operational since 26 November, with Yemenia flights daily basis. The first UNHAS flight to Aden is expected to take place on Monday 14 December.

1. Operational Updates

Sea Transport

- **MV Mainport Cedar** returned to Djibouti on 6 December. The next voyage is planned for 14 December with interagency cargo on behalf of IOM (40 mt).
- **MV Amsterdam** loaded containers at the terminal and is now waiting to berth at the conventional terminal to load bulk cargo. The planned cargo include WFP food and interagency cargo on behalf of WHO, ACF, UNFPA and IMC (261 mt).
- Over the next weeks, the Logistics Cluster is planning to conduct four voyages with WFP-contracted dhows to Hodeidah, with cargo from Oxfam, UNDP, IMC, DRC, UNFPA (226 mt), this will clear the backlog at Djibouti warehouse. The first dhow voyage, including cargo on behalf of Oxfam and UNDP (55 mt), is scheduled for 16 December.

Fuel

- The Logistics Cluster is working to implement a thorough quality monitoring system with monthly quality testing, though the Yemeni Petroleum Company (YPC). The plan is to conduct monthly quality testing of all fuel batches.

2. UNHAS

- UNHAS presented an operational update: since the beginning of the operation in April 2015:
 - 150 flights operated
 - Light Cargo airlifted by UNHAS passengers flights (for WHO , UNICEF , UNFPA, ACF ,MSF-F): 8.6 mt
 - 2,129 passengers transported from Djibouti to Sana’a (UN 1,654, INGOs 475) for 43 organisations
- UNHAS is currently following up with MoFA Jordan on the clearance to operate flights from Sana’a to Amman.
- UNHAS flight from Sana’a to Aden: clearance has been granted, the first flight is expected on 14 December.
