1. Situation Update

2. Operational Updates

Sea Transport

- The **MV AMSTERDAM** is currently at berth in Djibouti and is expected to depart on 27 December to Hodeidah forward to Aden with humanitarian cargo on behalf of ACF (13 mt; DJI 149) UNFPA (152 mt; DJI 065, 119,125), IRC (73 mt).
- The **MV MAINPORT CEDAR**, is currently at Djibouti, and is expected to load cargo on behalf of IOM (90 m³/30mt) before the new voyage to Aden.
- The **Dhow Amanat** left on 19 December and is expected to arrive in Hodeidah this afternoon with Oxfam and UNDP cargo (approximately 65.77 mt / 327.4 m³).
- The **Dhow Amanat** next voyage is expected to be on 26 December with cargo on behalf of UNFPA and IMC (170 mt / 329 m³).

Storage – Djibouti

- The Logistics Cluster will move out of the current Free zone warehouse by 31 December. Discussions are ongoing for a possible new warehouse inside the Free zone.

- Discussions are still ongoing regarding the possibility for the Logistics Cluster in Djibouti to move to the new WFP Logistics Hub PK20 on National Road number 11 (15 km from the Free zone). The Logistics Cluster to share more information once available.

Fuel

- Following recently reported fuel quality issues, laboratory tests are ongoing.
- An official letter for all organisations that received poor quality fuel will be issued next week. This will include the way forward and mitigation measures on fuel quality.
- WFP will set up a petrol station in Hodeidah built by a private contractor. The petrol station will be operational in the next three months.

3. UNHAS

- UNHAS is currently in Amman to discuss flight operations and modalities with competent authorities.
- The recent UNHAS Steering Committee meeting minutes and presentation will be shared via the Logistics Cluster mailing list.

- An airlift from Djibouti to Sana'a on behalf of IMC and Save the Children is expected to take place on 24 December.
