1. Introduction and Previous Action Points

- 40 nominations received from 16 organization for MSU set-up training.
- INTERSOS confirmed that there are no changes to curfew time in Bama and Ngala.
- The Logistics Sector coordinated a humanitarian convoy moving to Damboa on 19 July 2019.
- Most partners are now submitting their movement notification forms to the Logistics Sector by COB Wednesdays.

2. Civil-Military Coordination

- Partners are reminded that submission of cargo movement notification forms is now COB on Wednesdays for both the hard (two copies) and soft copies.
- Advisory: Ensure that all trucks and vehicles moving cargo have: approved partner cargo movement form, correspondence coverage letter from the Theatre Command and Seventh Division, waybills and the organization's visibility. Ensure that trucks leave on the planned date to avoid delays at the checkpoint.
- Partners are requested to ensure that the drivers at least have mobile phones for emergency communication.
- Partners are requested to direct access related issues and constraints to the Logistics Sector Civil-Military & Access Officer.

Road access

- North route accessible without escort until Monguno.

- North West route accessible without escort until Damasak.
- West route accessible without escort.
- South West Route to Damboa has been under closure due to ongoing operations. Military escorts for humanitarian cargo have been approved for once every ten days. The last escort to Damboa was on 19 July.
- South route is accessible without escort until Banki junction, where daily escort is available to Banki.
- East route is accessible with escort to be confirmed until Dikwa. Separate escorts to be confirmed from Dikwa to Ngala, and then onward to Rann. Due to the rainy season, Rann is only accessible for light vehicles/trucks of 10 – 15 MT not fully loaded, and the last humanitarian escort was on 20 July 2019. As we move deeper into the rainy season (from end of July toward August) Rann will be inaccessible. Partners are advised to plan accordingly. Collection point for Rann transit is at trailer park Ngala.

3. Common Storage

Facilities Update

- **Monguno** operated by Solidarités International:
 - Following the departure of the Project Manager, there has been slight delays in cargo registration.
- **Banki** operated by INTERSOS:
 - Construction of a slab for the temperature control facilities has finished. Discussion has been concluded with the IOM hub to supply electricity during day time and an alternative source of power during night time is being discussed.
- **Bama** operated by INTERSOS:
 - No changes in curfew time.
- **Ngala** operated by INTERSOS:
 - No changes in curfew time.
- **Damasak** operated by ACTED: No Update
- **Dikwa** operated by ACTED:
 - Preparations ongoing for the delivery of the climate-controlled storage.

4. Damboa Response Update

- Damboa-Maiduguri road is still closed.
- The Logistics Sector coordinated the convoy on July 19 with 28 trucks.
- The majority of partners who submitted Cargo Movement Notifications Forms for the 19 July movement to Damboa did not assemble. As these escorts have to be specially arranged with the military, partners are requested to adhere to their commitments.
- The next convoy is scheduled on August 8; however, this is yet to be confirmed.

5. Mobile Storage Unit (MSU) Training

The Logistics Sector will organise MSU set-up trainings on July 31 and August 1. 30 participants from 15 organizations will attend the trainings.

6. AOB

- Partners requested that the Logistics Sector advocates for the possibility of special escorts on the Ngala-Rann route in case of emergencies such as outbreak of disease. Escorts are currently not available for this route during the rainy season.
- Partners wishing to borrow the MSUs from the Logistics Sector should submit a request to the Sector Coordinator indicating the dimension needed.
