The Logistics Team will have a meeting with BNPB as the Coordinator of Logistics Cluster to submit today’s input/feedback.3. The Logistics Team together with BNPB team will convene a coordination meeting with the Logistics Department under the Task Force (multi-stakeholders unit) to agree upon the importance of synergizing elements of planning, requirements and distribution.4. The team will also have a coordination meeting with the Ministry of Health as well as the Ministry of Industry and Ministry of Trade to formulate a joint operation plan on PPEs requirements, integration of information management, and to creation of a dashboard to monitor requirements, availability and distribution.

During the meeting with Ministry of Health (MoH) on Tuesday, 24 March 2020, it was mentioned that the PPE requirements calculated for 45 days is 849,350,125 unit (eight hundred forty-nine million, three hundred fifty thousand and one hundred twenty-five unit). The calculation is based on WHO standard formulation and as agreed within the Ministry.

2. Points of Discussion

- National coordination on COVID-19 response is under the Head of BNPB as the Chief of the Task Force. COVID-19 coordination in sub national level is under Governors/Head of Districts/Mayors. Logistics Cluster is familiar with the coordination mechanism and will support. One of the cluster functions during readiness phase includes; integration into coordination cells (regardless terms used) established by the disaster command system (in COVID-19 response case is Task Force). Cluster has been supporting the command system in several emergency response. The discussions should **focus on the collective efforts** to improve and strengthen the coordination in Indonesia.
- PPEs requirements for Indonesia consider huge. Hence, focus should be on the critical time to immediately develop strategic joint effort.
- Currently data on PPEs requirements per district/municipalities is not being accessible to public. Therefore, gaps on PPEs needs cannot be followed up.
- BNPB is in the process on identifying in country suppliers for PPEs (currently 14 companies have been identified).
- BNPB is the COVID-19 coordinator. MoH is in charge in coordinating medical supplies (PPEs). Participants emphasized on logistics coordination and synergized operation, which includes:
 - Forecasting on needs (MoH)
 - Availability & fulfillment (Task Force Logistics Department – requires synergy)
 - Distribution (Logistics Cluster)
- Huge demand on PPE requirements which being purchase within the country and from abroad, a multi-stakeholders involvement including National Logistics Cluster is needed to support the MoH. The MoH as a technical ministry and Health Task Force can focus on providing health services.
- Coordination on PPE supplies is identified as one of the concerns; synergized between Health and Logistics Cluster is needed, as well as with the other ministries/sectors/clusters since the COVID-19 response will continue to expand as the impact will only get bigger.
