Australia	All airports		In order to manage and maintain quarantine arrangements across the jurisdictions of New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland and Western Australia, National Cabinet agreed to implement further caps on international arrivals, and an extension of current international passenger flight restrictions into Victoria. From Monday 13 July, the following will apply: Perth - a cap of 525 international arrivals per week will apply. Brisbane - an overall cap of 500 international arrivals per week will apply. Sydney - a cap of 450 international arrivals per day will continue, as announced on 4 July with a view to further reductions in subsequent weeks. Flexibility remains within these caps to as much as possible minimise disruptions to returning Australian citizens and permanent residents. These arrangements will be subject to a review by the National Cabinet before the end of July. Australia	All airports		You can only travel to Australia if you are an Australian citizen, a permanent resident, an immediate family member of an Australian citizen or permanent resident or are a New Zealand citizen usually resident in Australia. Travellers who have a compassionate or compelling reason to travel to Australia will need to have an exemption from the Australian Border Force Commissioner. All travellers arriving in Australia must undertake a mandatory 14-day quarantine at designated facilities (for example, a hotel), in their port of arrival. To transit Australia you must hold a valid visa or be from an eligible country to Transit Without a Visa (TWOV). If you don't hold a valid visa or are not eligible to TWOV you must apply for a visa to enter Australia. To transit Australia for up to 72 hours apply for a Transit visa (subclass 771). Bangladesh	All airports		CIVIL AVIATION AUTHORITY OF BANGLADESH21/04/2020: Suspension of Schedule International Flights To/From Bangladesh. 1. Considering the persistent risk and to avoid further expansion of pandemic COVID-19 throughout the country, with effect from 0001 BST on 15th April 2020 until 2359 BST on 30 April 2020, all scheduled international commercial passenger flights to/from Bahrain, Bhutan, Hongkong, India, Kuwait, Malaysia, Maldives, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Sri Lanka, Singapore, Thailand, Turkey, UAE and UK shall not be allowed to land at any Airport in Bangladesh. 2. Foreign nationals having valid visas will be required to produce a medical certificate (with English translation) to be obtained within 72 hours of travel, indicating that he/she does not have any symptoms of COVID-19. The individual needs to submit these certificates on arrival at the entry point (airport/sea port/land port) in Bangladesh. 3. If any Bangladesh origin passengers possess an NVR and come to Bangladesh without the required medical certificate mentioning that the concerned person is free from the Corona Virus Symptom, he/she would be institutionally quarantined for 14 (Fourteen) days. 4. If any Bangladesh origin passengers possess an NVR and come to Bangladesh with the required medical certificate mentioning that the concerned person is free from the Corona Virus Symptom, he/she would be home/self quarantined for 14 (Fourteen) days. However, if he/she is diagnosed with any symptom of Corona Virus on his/her arrival, he/she would be institutionally quarantined in for 14 (Fourteen) days. 5. International flights in regard to the following types shall be conducted as usual: a. Cargo b. Emergency Landing c. Technical Stop (Without crew rest) d. Medical Evacuation e. Special Flight Operation f. Relief/Humanitarian assistance g. All passengers arriving at PEK will have a PCR test and be quarantined at the designated location in Beijing for 14 days. 3. Passengers arriving at Shanghai Pudong (PVG) or Shanghai Hongqiao (SHA) must undergo a Nucleic Acid Test (NAT) and a 14-day quarantine in designated places for medical observation. - This does not apply to airline crew members. 4. If the crew is already away from Shanghai when the positive test result is available, the carrier will be informed by the authorities to take further action if necessary. 5. Airline crew arriving at Shanghai Pudong (PVG) or Shanghai Hongqiao (SHA) will be quarantined after they finish their last shift of flight. During their shift breaks, they are required to stay in crew hotels for isolation. 6. Passengers who live in or have been in France, Germany, Iran, Italy, Japan, Korea (Rep.), Spain or USA in the past 14 days arriving at Guangzhou (CAN) or Shenzhen (SZX) must undergo 14-day quarantine at home or in designated places for medical observation. All passengers arriving at SZX will have a PCR test. 7. All passengers arriving at XMN will be quarantined for medical observation at the designated hotels for 14 days on their own expenses. - This does not apply to passengers under 18 years old, passengers above 70 years old, pregnant women and passengers suffering from illness. They must apply for permission to undergo a 14-day quarantine at home.
