Air Tahiti Nui	28 July: Air Tahiti Nui is pleased to announce the official resumption of its commercial flights. This resumption will be gradual and will be subject to several conditions relating to health measures, to the reopening of some borders and to travel demands, which will inevitably be affected by this crisis. Papeete - Paris – Papeete route: Conditions of entry to the United States remain uncertain so the Papeete-Paris-Papeete schedule will initially operate via Vancouver, Canada instead of Los Angeles, USA throughout the month of July and August. - Flights from Papeete are scheduled on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday at 23.50 p.m. local time, transit via Vancouver. - Flights from Paris-CDG are scheduled on Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday at 12.05 p.m. local time, transit via Vancouver. From July 13, there will be an additional frequency on Tuesday for Papeete-Paris route and on Monday for Paris-Papeete route, bringing the number of frequencies to 5 flights per week. Travellers must obtain an electronic travel authorisation to be able to transit to Vancouver (YVR). The authorisation request must be made at the earliest before departure. Papeete - Los Angeles – Papeete route: From July 14, Air Tahiti Nui will operate 3 to 4 flights per week to and from Los Angeles. Papeete - Auckland – Papeete route: Flights scheduled for July and August on this route are cancelled. The reopening of this route is subject to the agreement of the New Zealand Government. Air Tahiti Nui invites you to regularly consult our website to learn about the latest news. Papeete - Tokyo – Papeete route: Flights scheduled for July, August and September on this route are cancelled. Air Tahiti Nui and its partners are examining a possible resumption of flights after this date. Air Vanuatu	21 July: Air Vanuatu announced today it will operate its second outbound repatriation flight on Thursday, 23 July 2020. In conjunction with the French Embassy in Port-Vila, Air Vanuatu will return 20 French Nationals to France, connecting via Noumea in New-Caledonia with Aircalin. Air Vanuatu has been updating its safe airport and in-flight protocols to ensure its crew, passengers and aircraft are covid-19 free and continuously collaborating with the Vanuatu Public Health authorities, IATA and other relevant Government agencies to ensure its health measures are fully compliant and ready when the borders reopen. Vanuatu's current State of Emergency does not allow any inbound repatriation until 01 August 2020, therefore, no passengers will be uplifted on the return flight.
