Quick Reference: Entry Points for Action

Select what you will “*support stakeholders with*”:

Pathway 1. Policy and regulatory environment

- developing and promoting evidence-based policies, legislation and other relevant regulatory instruments
- achieving relevant integration of related objectives, roles and responsibilities in other sector-specific instruments
- increasing engagement in relevant global and regional fora (including through SSC)

Pathway 2. Institutional effectiveness and accountability

- strengthening institutional mandate and recognition
- strengthening relevant coordination mechanisms
- strengthening effective dissemination of relevant information
- strengthening internal capabilities in Communications and Advocacy
- carrying out relevant business process analysis to identify opportunities for optimization, and where relevant, specifically through digitalization
- designing and developing more efficient, effective and economic business process models and operations
- rolling out optimised business models and operational processes
- reviewing design of existing information management systems.
- developing and rolling-out enhanced digital information management systems.
- strengthening relevant M&E practices and procedures
- delivering Training-of-Trainers in improved/revised M&E
- ensuring evidence informs the relevant solutions
- designing and developing assets, platforms and/or infrastructure
- utilizing, maintaining and managing assets, platforms and/or infrastructure
- strengthening national and local partnerships

Pathway 3. Strategic planning and financing

- articulating relevant evidence-based value proposition statements
- articulating strategic roadmaps and/or costed action plans
- advocating for required financing mechanisms and models
- designing and developing digital financial information management systems
- rolling-out relevant digital financial information management systems for preparedness

Pathway 4. Operational capacity

- strengthening relevant programme design
- strengthening operational implementation relevant programmes
- institutionalising capacity strengthening in critical skills and knowledge
- delivering Training-of-Trainers in improved/revised operational implementation

- operational implementation of relevant programmes
- establishing formal and systematic mechanisms to leverage the feed-back systems of related interventions
- designing and developing an effective grievance management mechanism
- rolling-out a grievance management system mechanism

Pathway 5. Engagement of other actors

- increasing engagement of other actors in programme design
- increasing engagement of other actors in programme implementation
- increasing engagement of other actors in programme M&E
- establishing a relevant research, development and innovation agenda
- developing higher-level educational programmes to build relevant national professional capacity
- creating a range of apprenticeship, internship and other on-the-job learning opportunities to promote employability of young professionals in the sector

The *Process Milestones* underlying each of the Entry-Points listed here will depend upon whether those Entry-Points are in support to “**hard processes**” (highlighted in red) or “**soft processes**”.
