Logistics Cluster Support to Sudan Crisis

Air transport

- To address the **most immediate needs**, the Logistics Cluster will coordinate the transportation of critical cargo by air **Ex-Juba to Malakal, Paloich and Renk**.
- **Special cargo** such as fuel, generators, vehicles etc may exceptionally be supported through air transport on free to user basis.
- Currently, emergency diesel fuel is airlifted on behalf of UNHCR to Renk and more rotations to conduct this week. Critical medical items were also transported to Renk on behalf of WHO.
- Service requests are received for fuel on behalf of IOM and nutrition items on behalf of UNICEF to Renk.
- The Logistics Cluster has **limited air transport capacity** to support a large-scale response by air. All air transport service requests for the response will be reviewed **on a case-by-case**.

River transport

- The air lifts are limited to critical cargo only and any **bulk cargo** request shall be moved by **river on full cost recovery** by the partner using WFP's On-Demand Service (ODS).
- Bulk cargo will be transported **Ex-Bor and Ex-Malakal**, partners to pre-position cargo in Bor by road.
- Should On-Demand Service be requested to transport bulky cargo, the Logistics Cluster will coordinate and **fast-track the movement** by engaging smaller and faster boats.
- The cluster has already provided a list of approved commercial boat and barge operators for organizations use.
- So far, the cluster supported UNICEF on river transport of Nutrition supplies to Malakal Ex-Bor.

Road transport

- When required the Logistics Cluster **coordinates ad hoc road convoys** to border locations based on physical access and security. The cluster has regular road convoy schedules but **departure schedules** for this support **will be modified** to suit organization's request.

Storage

- For critical cargo, the Logistics Cluster may loan partners Mobile Storage Unit (6x8, 10x24, 10x32).
- The Logistics Cluster provides common storage with Mobile Storage Units (MSUs) located in **Malakal, Bentiu and Wau**. Additionally, the cluster coordinates several common storage facilities managed by partners which are available for use by all sectors.

Prepositioning key points

- ✓ Prepositioning of cargo in strategic locations is cost-efficient and enhances preparedness for emergencies.
- ✓ Make use of road convoys from Juba/Bor, or Beyond Response road transport services from **Wau, Bentiu and Malakal**.
- ✓ There is common storage space available in many key locations (ConOps).
- ✓ All resources (transport schedules, convoy request form, etc) can be found on the website.
- ✓ Reduced funding = Logistics Cluster will not be able to fly to locations that were accessible by road.



Prepositioning updates

- ✓ Road Convoy schedules to Western corridor all the way to Bentiu is reduced to twice a week (Monday and Thursday) due to limited requests. (Bentiu road is now passable for 40 mt trucks).
- ✓ The most recent convoys to Northern Jonglei departed on 19 May 2023 and if there are plans to coordinate the next convoy LC will notify partners.
- ✓ The Convoy to Pibor is on hold due to security. Access and security working on clearances for the release.

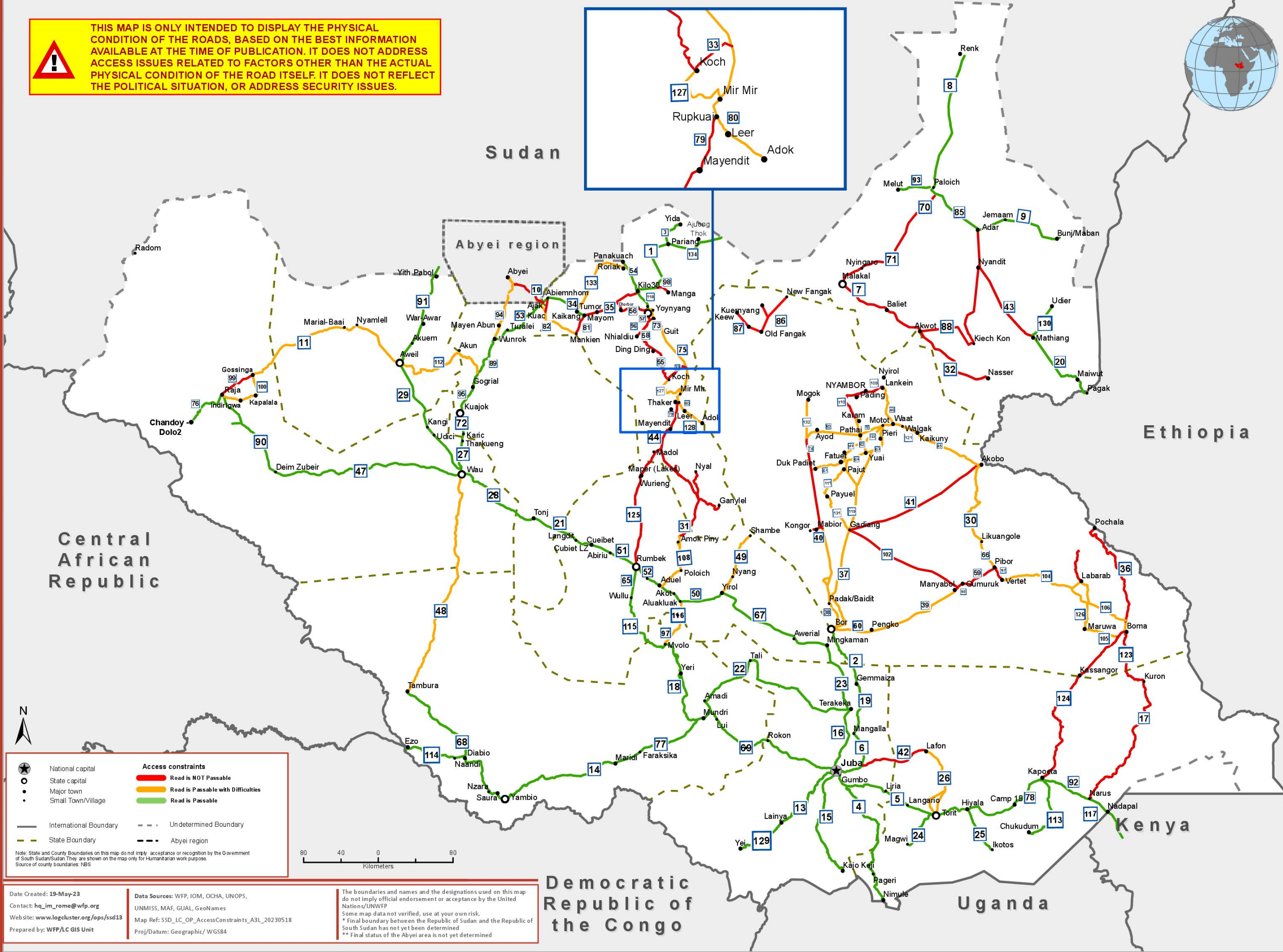
Beyond Responses (Wau, Malakal, Bentiu)

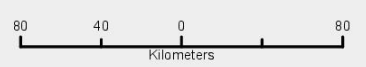
