1. Situation Update

- A 7.2 earthquake struck Tukastan on 10 September at 03:32 am, approximately 30 km west of Ugrigk.
- Heavy damage reported in Stichbundi, Ugrigk, and settlements in the Sirbok mountains.
- Collapsed structures, communication outages, and power system failures observed in affected areas.
- On 16 September 2025 at 05:30 am, a heavy aftershock hit Tukastan, followed by several smaller aftershocks south-west of the epicentre.

The total number of people affected in Tukastan is over 1,300,000. Death toll is over 2,300, with more than 83,000 people injured.



TRANSPORT NETWORK

The route from Sidharta to Ugriqik is accessible but with delays, taking 3 days to clear due to road damage, and is passable with 4x4 vehicles. The route from Stichbundi to Ugriqik is also not accessible. However, the route from Qazurum to Sidharta to Akbad is passable with 5 metric tonnes trucks. The route from Qazurum to Akbad is also passable with 5 metric tonnes trucks. The Aqcha to Qazurum to Akbad route is accessible without physical limitations, although there are checkpoints in place.

STORAGE, STAGING, AND DISTRIBUTION

Cold storage remains an option to explore for the storage and staging of relief items. Additionally, in Stichbundi an offer has been made in the cluster of 1500m² of dry storage for a period of three weeks, with cross-docking that can be made available. This will aid in the distribution of essential supplies to the affected areas.

2. Logistics Cluster Concept of Operations

INFORMATION MANAGEMENT

The updated Concept of Operations (ConOps) was communicated to the partners and will be uploaded with the latest updates. The Logistics Information Exchange (LOG IE) is continuing to be updated, providing partners with access to all current information. All relevant documents are being uploaded to the Logistics Cluster website, including facility assessment reports, situation update reports, guidance materials, SOPs.

LOGISTICS SERVICES

During today's Logistics Cluster meeting with partners, several key service needs were highlighted to support ongoing humanitarian operations in Tukastan. Today, the Ministry of Finance granted an exemption waiver on all duties and taxes related to the importation of relief goods destined for emergency operations. It was noted that this exemption is valid for registered NGOs and UN agencies only. We received confirmation from partners in the meeting that with this now in place, and the customs clearance process expedited goods coming through.

In addition, partners highlighted the ongoing challenges with onward movement. The LET meeting was scheduled for later in the day, where trucking issues will be discussed. ACHE and cargo handling equipment have been offered to support the logistics efforts. Partners also emphasized the importance of addressing these logistical challenges to ensure the timely delivery of relief items to the affected areas. Exploration of the trucking companies are continued to be explored.
