A discussion was held to identify those logistical areas of concern / interest to participants. Key issues identified included storage facilities outside of Port-au-Prince, and customs clearance. <p>Transport</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Within the past week the Logistics Cluster has moved 17mt of cholera emergency supplies, hygiene kits and WASH items, as well as 27mt of tents and lumber for the earthquake response. These have been dispatched from Port-au-Prince to nine locations: Dufour, Fort Liberté, Jeremie, Kenscoff, Les Cayes, Pestel, Port-de-Paix, Saut d'Eau, as well as within Port-au-Prince. Transport services also continued in the regions with the dispatch of 234mt of cholera relief items from Gonaives, Cap-Haitien and Jacmel to the surrounding areas in need. Ten organisations and one Government institution made use of the services, namely GOAL, Handicap International/Atlas Logistique, IOM, J/P Haitian Relief Organisation, Médecins du Monde – Swiss, Merlin, Nacion en Transformacion, UNFPA, WFP, WHO/PAHO and the Ministère de la Santé Publique et de la Population (MSPP). <p>Storage</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Two containers from Logistics Cluster stocks in Port-au-Prince have been made available for WHO. These will be used to increase their storage capacity for cholera relief items in Miragoane.

Overall, since air operations began on 5 August 2010, the Logistics Cluster has facilitated airlift of 12,113 mt of relief cargo for 14 organisations. <p>Strategic Warehouses</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Logistics Cluster, with the cooperation of the Punjab Provincial

An MOU is being negotiated with UNMIS to ensure emergency supply of fuel through team sites if required. • A summary of fuel prices is being compiled. This will be monitored and updated on a weekly basis. Fuel is readily available through providers in Juba but shortages are still noted in the northern Border States. <p>Coordination</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A new format for core pipeline has been circulated to managers. Meetings have also been held to discuss the way forward. New figures will be provided next week <p><u>Northern Sudan</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The UNJLC name change has been finalised and UNJLC (SO 103422) is now formally known as the WFP Logistics Coordination Unit. Donors, Partners and implementing organizations have all been advised. <p>NFI & ES Sector Coordination</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Uncertainty in the ability of Catholic Relief Services (CRS) to resume operations, after they were halted by National Intelligence and Security Services (NISS) for security reasons, is affecting finalizations of NFI distributions for winter season in West Darfur. CRS is one of the 10 organizations recommended for allocation by the Technical Review Group following the review of 25 proposals submitted for the CHF 2011 1st Round Allocation for the NFI&ES Sector on 19 January. • FAO held a meeting on 7 February 2011, to present their preliminary results of the warehouses capacity study in northern Sudan. WFP LCU contributes through GIS information mapping.

Coordination

- An Inter Cluster support mission to Yemen is scheduled for 12-18 March 2011.
- The Logistics Cluster continues to facilitate a UN flight to Sa'ada, as it is the only way accessing the north of the country.
- The ERF proposal to secure funding for air operations until May 2010 was approved at OCHA CO level; it has been send to Geneva for approval.
- Two official letters attached with SAOP (Standard Administration Operation Procedure) has been send to Sa'ada Governor and Sana'a airport security chief to enhance their understanding of UNHAS operation procedures.
